RECENT ACCIDENT ON BASS LAKE ROAD

The sharp curve on Bass Lake Road was the scene of another accident on Thursday morning, July 30, at around 9:00 AM. According to persons who reportedly talked to one of the drivers, one car allegedly crossed over the centerline and struck the other. No injuries were reported.

Over the years the Bulletin has reported a number of accidents that have occurred on this section of Bass Lake Road. People who live near the curve generally believe that excessive speed going into the curve has been the cause of most of those accidents. Long-time residents say that the number of accidents involving cars leaving the road has declined since the county grooved the pavement on the curve around ten years ago.

The conditions at the curve are scheduled to be improved when the south segment of Silver Springs Parkway is extended down to Bass Lake Road sometime around 2017 or 2018, according to the county Capital Improvement Plan (CIP).

That project will construct the southern segment of Silver Springs Parkway as a twolane road connecting Bass Lake Road to the southern terminus of the northern segment of Silver Springs Parkway. The northern segment has been completed but is currently closed to traffic. The southern portion of the parkway will intersect Bass Lake Road at the present sharp curve.

The project would also realign and reconstruct Bass Lake Road for a distance of approximately 800 feet south and approximately 500 feet east of the Silver Springs Parkway intersection. The project includes installation of Class II bicycle lanes and concrete sidewalks on both sides of the parkway, and a landscaped center median. The project is identified in the El Dorado County CIP as "Silver Springs Parkway to Bass Lake Road (south segment)" ~

BLAC DIRECTOR TO SERVE ON GRAND JURY

The Honorable Dylan Sullivan presided over the swearing in of El Dorado County's 2015-16 Grand Jury and filed the formal notice June 25. This year's jury includes Hal Erpenbeck, a member of the Board of Directors of Bass Lake Action Committee.

The El Dorado Civil Grand Jury is an investigatory body created for the protection of society and the enforcement of the law. It is an arm of the Court and a representative of the public. Although it is an arm of the Court, it operates independently of direct Court supervision. It is a check against governmental authority. It is not a branch of the County, nor is it answerable to the District Attorney

Suzanne Thurman, grand jury coordinator and administrative analyst, said that typically the grand jury impanels 18 members, one foreman and four or five alternates. Jurors participated in grand jury training July 1-2 sponsored by the California Grand Jury Association. ~
